


WHAT CAN I SAY WHEN....

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WHAT CAN I SAY WHEN

My child does not know a word?

- Nothing. (Give your child a few seconds to give it a try first)
- Use the picture to help.
- Re-read the sentence up to the word and try those sounds.
- "What would make sense?"
- Skip it and read on. (Return to the word at the end of the sentence)
- "Could it be _____?" Check to see if it is right.

My child misreads a word?

- "Did that make sense?"
- "Did that sound right?"
- "Do those letters match with the word you said?"
- "Try that again."
- "Could it be _____?"
 Check to see if it is right

Does it make sense?	Skip it and read on, go back and fill it in.	Take a running start.	Look at the pictures!	S-t-r-e-t-c-h Out the sounds.
